Davis-UWC IMPACT Challenge



In August 2015, UWC International announced an additional US \$15 million funding boost through a gift by UWC Patron, Shelby M.C. Davis, who currently also funds the Davis United World College Scholars Program.

Thanks to the Davis-UWC IMPACT Challenge, charitable donations from UWC alumni, their families and other individual supporters to the 17 UWC institutions will be matched up to the value of US \$1 million per college.

More about Davis-UWC IMPACT at LPCUWC:

- Alumni, parents, family and friends of UWC are eligible for gift matching
- To unlock the matched funding, LPCUWC needs to exceed the number of donors from the previous year
- Once unlocked, the total amount of donations will be matched 100%, whilst gifts from new donors are matched at an additional 100% and gifts from existing donors at an additional 50%
- All funds raised will support scholarships for LPCUWC students
- The deadline for gift matching in the current period is July 31st 2017. All gifts received before this date will count towards the participation rate and the total amount to be matched
